RECOGNIZE:

As you study the theme of honor and teach your children to treat others with respect, read books that explain how and why we show honor to those who serve in the military and remember those who sacrificed their lives for their country. Visit war memorials and remembrance ceremonies in your area and look for ways to honor those who currently serve.

MEMORIZE:

On Memorial Day or Remembrance
Day, we honor those who have fallen
while serving their country. John
McCrae's "In Flander's Field"
describes his experience after
burying a fellow soldier. Teach your
child to recognize what a poppy looks
like, and help your child learn about
the background of the poem as they
memorize it this month.



DISPLAY:

Teach your children how to give honor to others in their day to day lives. Show your children how to make introductions and greet others with a handshake and make eye contact.

Teach them to honor people who are older than they are by holding doors, giving up their seat, and offering help.

WAY 3:



Way 3 states, "We honor and obey our parents in the Lord with a respectful attitude." As you teach about honor, let <u>Our 24 Family Ways</u> help you remind your children that one of God's commands to them is to "honor your parents." If your parents are still living, show your children ways that you continue to honor their grandparents, too.
