## Awaking Wonder Space



## **INSPIRE:**

Read Isaiah 40:21-31 aloud with your children and discuss. Choose a portion of it to memorize. On a clear night, observe the stars together. While you watch the stars, read Isaiah 40:26 and stand in awe of our Mighty God. An app like Star Walk 2 can help identify the things you observe.

## LEARN:

Read a wide range of space-themed books with your children. From earlier scientists like Galileo, Copernicus, Kepler, and Newton to modern day endeavors like the Hubble Space Telescope, International Space Station, and the Mars Rover, create a timeline of space related milestones and discoveries.



## **OBSERVE:**

Look for opportunities to view space. Local weather forecasters often share when meteorite showers are visible and where and when to view an eclipse. Visit a planetarium, a space museum, space center, or space research facility. There are virtual field trips and live rocket launches to enjoy as well.
