READ:

After the Louisiana Purchase in 1803, President Thomas Jefferson asked Captain Meriwether Lewis and Captain William Clark to lead a Voyage of Discovery in exploring the new territory. They were especially hoping to find a water route to the Pacific Ocean. As you read about the expedition, pay attention to how they prepared and what helped the journey succeed.

During their journey, the explorers discovered and studied animals, flora, and fauna in the new territory. Lewis especially had an interest in botany, and he collected plant samples throughout their travels. Learn what you can about what they found. Try pressing and drying plants from your nature studies.
